The MNPS Virtual School, and the parents of the students participating in activities, services, and programs funded by Title I, Part A of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA)(Grades 4-12), agree that this compact outlines how the parents, the entire school staff, and the students will share the responsibility for improved student academic achievement and the means by which the school and parents will build and develop a partnership that will help children achieve the State's high standards.

The MNPS Virtual School will:

1. Provide high-quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that enables the participating children to meet the State's student achievement standards as follows:
 - Strive to meet the different academic, social, emotional, and developmental needs of each student.
 - Ensure that all students receive a rigorous curriculum outlined by the state and MNPS.
 - Provide support and interventions based on the individual needs of the student.
 - Provide parents with resources to assist their children in needed areas of academic concern.
 - Hold parent-teacher conferences related to your individual child's achievement. These conferences will be held once during the fall semester and once during the spring semester. Other conferences may be held as deemed necessary by the request of the parent and/or teacher.
 - Provide parents with frequent reports on their children's progress.
 - Provide ongoing communication of student progress through email, phone/text messages, student progress reports, and other data assessment tools provided at the school and district level.
 - Communicate assessment results to identify the child's strengths and areas for improvement.
 - Be available to you, the parent, during specified teacher office hours. The administrators and counseling staff will be available during regular school hours.
 - Provide parents opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's class, and to observe classroom activities.

VS Parents will:

- Communicate with my child's teachers by attending conferences, sending/answering e-mail messages, and reviewing student progress reports.
- Ensure that my student has satisfactory attendance and submits assignments on time.
- Provide a quiet space for my student to learn and complete assignments.
- Support my child in their self-advocacy.
- Ensure that my child attends mandatory in-person testing and other VS required events/activities.
- Communicate with the school when any changes occur in address, phone numbers, email addresses, health-related issues, or other educational-related issues.
- Be respectful with my words and actions for my child, other children and their families, teachers, and other school staff.
- Support VS administration in the education of my child.

VS Students will:

- Take responsibility for my academic success and behavior.
- Show integrity in assignment completion and submissions.
- Complete all assignments on time.
- Communicate with my teachers regarding my coursework and expectations.
- Check emails daily.
- Take pride in my school and realize that I am responsible for my words, actions, and behavior while at school and attending school functions.
